Leading Through Fatigue, **Complexity and Uncertainty**

In today's fast-paced work environment, leaders are expected to stay resilient and optimistic amid constant change, increasing demands, and widespread challenges such as change fatigue, workplace conflict, employee disengagement, and the need to maintain a culture of innovation and psychological safety. This webinar addresses these issues by introducing a whole-brain approach to leadership designed to help leaders sustain peak performance both professionally and personally.

Participants will gain insights into how the brain and body influence leadership effectiveness and will be encouraged to challenge traditional beliefs about resilience, work-life balance, and leadership. The session explores key elements such as optimism, emotional intelligence, mental resilience, and diverse thinking, providing tools and strategies to cultivate these qualities. Attendees will leave with practical techniques and personalized approaches to enhance motivation and build a resilient, innovative workplace culture.

13 Factors of Psychological Health and Safety

The workshop focusses on the foundation of Psychological Health and Safety (PHS) at work, and explores 13 factors shown to contribute to a psychologically healthy and safe workplace:

- Organizational culture
- Psychological and Social Support
- Clear Leadership and Expectations
- Civility and Respect
- Psychological Competencies and Demands
- Growth and Development
- Recognition and Reward
- Involvement and Influence
- Workload Management
- Engagement
- Balance
- Psychological Protection
- Protection of Physical Safety.

Each factor is examined, and a format is provided for brainstorming, considering, identifying, and selecting actions that could support each factor. A bibliography, list of resources, and list of references are also provided.

Yukon First Nations 101

Code YFN 001 \$395 + GST Yukon First Nations 101 has been developed to educate students, employees, and the public about the history and culture of First Nations in the Yukon. The course also touches on the cultural values shared among Yukon First Nations today and how to communicate respectfully with First Nation individuals and communities.

This talk will introduce you to the major themes of aging consciously and is an invitation to begin the journey-to embark on a path of continued growth and development.

Conscious Aging: Transitions (1 day workshop)

Recent research shows that we are in transition in our lives more often than when we are on some stable plateau. Getting older does not stop transitional processes. Life continues to happen as we age. One of life's great transitional periods is retirement. Related to that is the transition from adulthood to elderhood. In this workshop we explore the structure and dynamics of life transitions and how we can successfully navigate them, with particular reference to the second half of life.

Conscious Aging: Harvesting Wisdom from Lived Experience (1 day workshop)

Code JUST CE86 \$150 + GST A core aspect of aging consciously and embracing our elderhood is intentionally reviewing our lives with the goal of separating the metaphorical wheat (wisdom) from the chaff (the totality of one's lived experience). In this workshop we engage with a number of different exercises to help us see our life as a story full of challenges, disappointments, losses, and triumphs. Out of this we begin to harvest wisdom and embark on the path of true elderhood.







FASD for Frontline Workers

Code FASD CE01 \$550 + GST This training program is designed to equip social service providers in the Yukon with essential knowledge and skills to support individuals affected by Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD). The course covers foundational knowledge, identification and assessment, intervention strategies, and specialized topics. The training structure is as follows:

- Core Foundations & Best Practices Understanding key principles and methodologies in social services.
- Practical Applications Engaging in scenario-based learning, role-playing, and case studies.
- Advanced Skills & Problem-Solving Addressing complex challenges, ethical considerations, and innovative solutions.
- Review & Certification Reflecting on key takeaways, assessing knowledge, and certification upon completion

Learning Approach: The course combines lectures, group discussions, hands-on activities, case studies, and role-playing exercises to provide a well-rounded learning experience. Participants will gain both theoretical knowledge and practical tools to enhance their effectiveness in the field.

Transformational Leadership: Segment A - The Resilient Leader

Code JUST CE137 \$135 + GST

This dynamic workshop empowers participants to cultivate energy, confidence, and optimism, which is essential for thriving as leaders both professionally and personally. Grounded in the EQEX VIDA Entera Resiliency Framework and Dr. Tara Swart's whole-brain leadership theory, the course offers practical tools to design a personalized mental resiliency practice that supports peak brain function and sustains well-being.

Participants will explore the six neural pathways of whole-brain leadership, uncover myths about leadership and human development, and connect mental resiliency to emotional intelligence. Through hands-on exercises and self-reflection, learners will gain strategies to strengthen optimism, assess their leadership impact, and access personalized resources to support lasting transformation in both work and life.

Transformational Leadership: Segment B - The Resilient Organization

Code JUST CE138 \$135 + GST

This workshop introduces the concept of organizational resiliency through the EQEX VIDA Entera Resiliency Framework, guiding participants to explore the cultural dynamics that support or hinder their workplace. It encourages curiosity about employee experiences and the workplace environment, helping leaders and teams assess how organizational culture impacts engagement, psychological safety, risk management, and innovation.

Participants will learn to apply key principles such as energy and trust equations to their organizations, fostering conditions for optimal business performance and high-trust environments. The session also connects resiliency to emotional intelligence, offering tools to assess and strengthen a group's ability to navigate challenges. Attendees will leave with practical insights and resources to begin crafting a tailored resiliency plan for their teams.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST)

Code ASIS 002 \$245 + GST Fee

Professionals, volunteers and informal helpers all need to know how to help people with thoughts of suicide, in ways that increase their suicide safety. This interactive workshop teaches participants to recognize when someone may have thoughts of suicide; and to work with that person to create a plan that will support their immediate safety. Participants will learn to:

- Identify people who have thoughts of suicide
- Understand how your beliefs and attitudes can affect suicide interventions
- Seek a shared understanding of the reasons for thoughts of suicide and the reasons for living
- Review current risk and develop a plan to increase safety from suicidal behavior for an agreed amount of time
- Follow up on all safety commitments, accessing further help as needed. Participants don't need any formal training to attend this workshop—anyone 16 or older can attend the workshop, learn and use the ASIST model.

Navigating Difficult Client Relationships

Code JUST CE120 **Fee** \$329 + GST or \$299 + GST early bird

For those who work in a helping role, it can be very challenging when clients are vulnerable, stressed-out, or quick to engage in conflict. Complicating matters is that difficult dynamics in the relationship are often amplified by different styles of communication. This workshop reviews what contributes to these challenges, including the intrapersonal, interpersonal, and organizational factors. By looking at case studies, participants will learn how to alter their interactions with clients they find difficult, in order to transform unhealthy relational patterns into more positive interactions and outcomes.

This introductory level workshop is intended for social service and health care personnel, support workers, school personnel, and anyone working with people who exhibit challenging behaviors. The workshop includes presentations, video, case study exercises, experiential practice, personal reflection, and small group discussions.

Motivational Interviewing

Code JUST CE118 **Fee** \$329 + GST or \$299 + GST early bird It is common for people to struggle and experience ambivalence when considering making a change or when others may be expecting them to make one. When those working in helping roles encounter this ambivalence in their clients, it is often interpreted as resistance, and they may feel unable to respond in an effective way.

Motivational Interviewing is a method for helping people find their internal motivation for finding solutions to their problems. Participants will learn strategies that start from a place of empathy and draw on the client's personal motivation to create their own goals for change. This introductoryintermediate level workshop is for social service and health care professionals, social workers, school personnel, and anyone supporting people. The workshop includes presentations, video, experiential practice, case study exercises, personal reflection, and small group discussions.

Loss in the Workplace

Code JUST CE105 \$135 + GST Fee

Every workplace will inevitably experience loss. When that happens-whether it is the death of a co-worker, loss of a family member, chronic illness, or other losses-the impact can ripple throughout the workplace affecting morale, motivation, and ultimately, productivity. Loss in the Workplace, developed by Hospice Yukon, offers tools to help prepare for loss and grief in your work environment, as well as insight and knowledge about:

- The nature of how we heal.
- Practical tools to help you provide effective leadership in crises and high stress periods.
- Anticipating the challenges of supporting employees through difficult times.
- Establishing appropriate support and maintaining productivity in your unique work.

De-escalating Potentially Violent Situations

Code JUST CE75 **Fee** \$329 + GST or \$299 + GST early bird For those who work in an environment where there is potential for violence, it is important to develop the skills needed to defuse dangerous situations. This 1-day workshop is designed to teach people to de-escalate potentially violent situations through assertiveness and interpersonal communication. The training will explore how anger and violence interplay, including opportunities for self-assessment of personal communication styles. Participants will develop a clear understanding of how to assess the potential for violence and respond with a diverse set of interpersonal tools and strategies designed to defuse potentially violent situations. The workshop is intended for anyone wanting to learn more about violence and interpersonal strategies useful in de-escalating the imminent threats of violence.

Mental Health First Aid for Northern Peoples

Code JUST 034 Fee \$285 + GST This northern version of the Mental Health First Aid Canada course integrates material that reflects the experiences of Aboriginal peoples-First Nation, Inuit, and Metis. In addition, this course addresses the importance of holism and balance. The whole person-mental, physical, social, emotional, and spiritualmust be considered when providing mental health first aid. Mental Health First Aid for Northern Peoples is guided by several important principles including respect, cooperation, community, harmony, generosity, and resourcefulness.

The Environmental Monitoring Certificate program equips First Nations students with technical skills and knowledge to conduct environmental monitoring tasks associated with entry-level positions with First Nation or other governments, industry, field researchers, or environmental services companies.

In this program, you will learn a variety of methods to collect and record observations, report them to decision makers in a professional manner, and repeat to look for change over time. The 10 credit courses are modular and are delivered primarily at remote industrial and research locations around the Yukon in camp settings. Courses are complemented with a number of non-credit safety and operator certifications. The program will normally be completed within two years, with eight-day modules delivered approximately every one or two months, allowing you to continue with work and life obligations while earning your certificate. The program focuses on both western scientific and traditional Indigenous methods of monitoring environmental conditions. Open to First Nations citizens with grade 10-level English and math credits.




What does a career in water and wastewater look like?

Operators run and maintain the systems that provide clean drinking water to communities and/or the systems that remove and treat wastewater. These systems include wells, pumps, water treatment equipment, and piping networks.

Operator duties include water sampling and testing, equipment startup and shutdowns, communication with the public, piping and equipment repairs, system troubleshooting, and more.

The water and wastewater sectors are rapidly changing and growing career areas with shortages of qualified workers to fill positions.
