

# CSE Citation and Reference Guide

This guide is based on the 8<sup>th</sup> edition (2014) of Scientific Style and Format: The CSE annual for Authors, Editors, and Publishers. (Reference Collection - T11 .5386 2014).

#### **In-Text References**

- Use the Name-Year system for In-text references. This system consists of surname(s) of the author and the year of publication of the document. In-text citations must appear in brackets, no comma between surname and year. <a href="Example: This claim was later refuted"><u>Example: This claim was later refuted (Jones 2008)</u></a>. OR Jones (2008) later refuted this claim.
- If you are **citing a specific part of a document** (e.g. direct quotation, or a figure, chart or table), it is recommended to include also the page number. <u>Example:</u> These results clearly contradict those published in 2004 by the Smith lab. (Jones 2008, p. 56).
- If using multiple works by the **same author published in different years**, cite the publication year in chronological order. Example: (Smith 1998, 2005).
- If you are citing works by the same author published in the same year, add a designator (a, b, c...) to distinguish the works. Use the same designators in the reference list. Example: (Dubois 1976a; Dubois 1976b)
- If document has **two authors**, insert an "and" between surnames. <u>Example:</u> (Bassett and Zueli 2000).
- If document has **three or more authors**, use *et al.* after the first author surname. <u>Example:</u> (Field et al. 2005).
- If you are citing several sources at once, list them in chronological order, or alphabetically if two or more works were published in the same year, and separate each one with a semicolon.

  <u>Example:</u> (Samson 1963; Carter and Bowles 1975; Grimes 1975; Anderson et al. 1992).
- If date of publication cannot be determined, use the year of access (for online sources) or [date unknown] for print publications. Example: (Smith [date unknown])
- **No author:** begin the in-text citation with the first word or first few words of the title, followed by an ellipsis. Example: (Handbook... c2000)

## Citing your sources in the Reference List

- The reference list comes at the end of your paper and includes full bibliographic information for all the sources in text.
- The references are listed in alphabetical order by first author last name.
- Journals titles are generally abbreviated, excepting one-word titles (Nature, Science).

# Basic Formulas (note the punctuation!)

### **Book**

Last name, First names initials. Year. Book title. Edition. City of Publication: Publisher. Extent (pagination).

## Article (online)

Last name, First names initials. Year. Article title. Periodical title Initials. [date updated; date accessed]; Volume(issue): location. Notes.
