#### Course cancellation

We must receive a minimum number of registrations in order to proceed with a course. If there is not sufficient registration by the registration deadline, the course may be cancelled. Some courses have unique registration deadlines due to the requirements of the course – be sure to check.

#### Registration deadline

The registration deadline is typically seven business days prior to the course start date. You may register after the registration deadline.

#### **Course fees**

You must pay all course fees when you register. We accept payment by Visa, Mastercard, Amex, cash, debit, cheque, money order, or purchase order. We will not accept post-dated cheques.

## Withdrawing from a course

If you need to withdraw from a course, please notify the Admissions Office in person or by telephone (867 668 8710) five business days prior to the course start date to allow for a refund.

#### Withdrawal policy

Continuing Studies will issue you a refund if you withdraw from a course at least five business days prior to the course start date. If you withdraw fewer than five business days before the start of the course, you will forfeit all course fees.

Drawing on the north's leadership, unique values and diverse cultures, the NISJ delivers training courses and encourages support for related research.

The NISJ, part of Yukon College, coordinates, develops and delivers training courses to people in social justice-related jobs and careers in public and First Nation governments, non-government organizations, and businesses. The jobs are found in many fields, including corrections, counseling, education, emergency services, health and wellness, investigation, justice, policing, regulatory enforcement, social services, etc. The courses are delivered primarily to frontline workers, but also supervisors, managers, members of boards and tribunals, students and the general public.

Course development and delivery is an on-going activity. Please check the website or contact the NISJ for information about other courses available through the institute, or to discuss training needs and the possibility of developing and delivering new courses. NISJ courses are developed and delivered by instructors from the college, community, public and private sectors. The institute provides "common training" in which members of the public and organizations train together; and "contract training" in which people from one workplace or organization train together.



- A good knowledge base for an entry-level position in the job force.
- Completed the theoretical requirements for Level I of the Millwright Apprenticeship program, 570 hours towards the student's apprenticeship (pending approval of the Apprenticeship Board), and have the opportunity to write the first year Apprenticeship Exam.

## Multi-Trade Industrial Technician

Requested by Yukon's mining industry, the Multi-Trade Industrial Technician program is designed to offer training which meets the needs of the local

This program offers students the opportunity to learn about the basics of mining trades and to develop entry-level skills to work alongside, and aid, staff at production mines. This program combines classroom theory, shop work and field activity. Shop instruction will introduce students to maintenance, welding, heavy equipment mechanics, and millwright techniques.

At the end of the program, students will have:

- Acquired practical hands-on experience with a variety of stationary and portable power tools, welding equipment and mechanics.
- A good knowledge base for an entry-level position in the job force.

#### **Environmental Monitoring**

The Environmental Monitoring Certificate program equips students with technical skills and knowledge to conduct environmental monitoring tasks associated with entry-level positions. This program consists of 10 credited courses and one outdoor skills/first aid partial-credit course (the first aid portion will be red-cross certified, not college credit). Courses will be offered modularly at various camp locations throughout the Yukon. The program will normally be completed within 2 years.

All program seats are reserved for Yukon First Nation students.

#### **Earth Sciences**

**Duration** 2-year or 3-year pathways

**Delivery** On campus & in field



The Earth Sciences program uses classroom, field and laboratory instruction to deliver the first two years of a B.Sc. degree in geoscience. Students have the advantage to complete introductory science courses in a personalized environment characterized by small sizes and dedicated instructors. Geology programming uses Yukon's local landscapes and partnerships with industry to provide experiential learning opportunities that prepare students to meet the needs of employers and solve big-picture earth science problems facing society today. Flexible delivery options are available for some courses for students interested in distance education.

In partnership with Vancouver Island University (VIU)'s Department of Earth Science, students in the YukonU Earth Sciences program can transfer all credits directly towards completion of a B.Sc. in geoscience at VIU.

#### **Physical Geology**

This course is an introduction to the origin, structure, and composition of Earth. Topics covered include atomic structure and minerals; igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks; weathering, erosion and depositional processes; earth composition and structure; volcanism, earthquakes, and rock deformation. Hands-on laboratory exercises focus on rock and mineral identification, basic outcrop description, and geologic map reading, construction, and analysis.


