

n2n Student Checklist

Step 1

Eligibility



I study at a north2north member institution in Canada



I have good academic standing



I have completed at least one year of post-secondary studies



I will travel before March 2027



I am a Canadian citizen (*if not, see step 2.5*)



I understand that funding priorities are as follows:

1. Indigenous students in or from the north (YT, NT, NU, Labrador)
2. Non-Indigenous students in or from the north (YT, NT, NU, Labrador)
3. All other Canadian students studying at a north2north member institution. Students who are enrolled in or interested in studying programs related to Arctic, Indigenous or Northern Circumpolar studies will be prioritized

Step 2

Apply for Canadian north2north Funding



I choose where I want to go on the [UArctic website](#)



I choose up to three universities with programs or courses I'm genuinely interested in



I meet with my north2north coordinator to prepare my application



I have my transcript in English ready



I complete the questionnaire and the application form on the [YukonU Study Abroad](#) website



I submit my application on the Study Abroad website by February 15

Step 2.5

Apply for other north2north Funding



I apply for Finland, Norway or Denmark funding if:

-I want to study in Finland, Norway or Denmark

and

-I am not a Canadian citizen and/or

-I am not from the Canadian Territories or studying there

Step 3

Apply to the Host Institution



I meet with my north2north or exchange coordinator to learn the application procedure

Behind the scenes... (here's what happens after I apply)

1. The steering committee reviews all applications for the Canadian funding and selects funding recipients.
2. The Canadian team confirms with Nordic partners that no student receives multiple north2north awards.
3. Funding results are sent to students in early March.
4. If any of my chosen institutions require a waiver, the Canadian n2n coordinator will try to request it on my behalf.

Step 4-A

If I Receive north2north Canadian Funding

- I confirm my participation by replying that I still plan to take part in the exchange.

- I complete all required documents as soon as I receive the instruction email:
 - A confirmation email from my north2north coordinator (short-term) **OR** an acceptance letter from my host institution (semester/field school)
 - My SIN number (I can call the national n2n coordinator instead of emailing it)
 - My direct deposit form + void cheque or banking details
 - My participant waiver, filled out and signed
 - My proof of travel insurance (arranged with my home n2n coordinator)
 - My flight confirmation (economy only)

Step 4-B

If I don't Receive north2north Canadian Funding

- I check whether I receive funding from my host institution

- If I applied to a university requiring a tuition waiver, I watch for updates from the national coordinator

- I decide if I still want to participate in an exchange without funding (or a waiver)
