To be submitted by email to innovation@yukoncollege.yk.ca <u>no later than 11:59 pm PST on Friday, February 28th, 2020.</u> Applications can be completed by teams, or individuals, on a computer using this fillable PDF form. You can attend application info sessions to receive expert advice & application support (see <u>website</u> for details). Be sure to save your responses periodically. Include "YIP 2020" and your name in the final saved file name.

Winners

Winners will be selected by an independent panel of judges, using standard judging criteria. Winners will be contacted individually on, or after March 25th, and will be announced publicly on March 30th, 2020 at an event hosted at NorthLight Innovation (2180 2nd Avenue, Whitehorse).

Prizes

Seven prizes will be awarded: six \$5,000 prizes and one \$10,000 prize. All prize recipients will also recieve five hours of professional (wrap-around) support services to help advance their idea. These services will be tailored to the needs of each project.

Tips on preparing your application

Keep it short

There are character limits for each answer. Additional pages or responses will not be considered. We encourage applicants to keep their answers short by focusing on the most important information. Full sentences are not required. Clear point-form is acceptable.

Ask questions

Information sessions are a valuable opportunity to ask questions and get help. We encourage you to review the application form first and think about how you would answer the questions (maybe even draft your responses), so that you know what questions you want to ask during the info sessions. See website for info session times.

Clearly describe what you will do if you win

Your idea or project can be at any stage of development. The application should focus on what immediate next steps would be possible if you received a prize. Be clear about what you could do with a \$5,000 prize vs. a \$10,000 prize.

You don't have to be perfect

You (and your team) bring great skills and strengths to this project and we want to hear about it! But you can't know everything. Describe what gaps you have, what questions you don't have answers to, what risks exist, or what you don't know about how the project can work. That information helps identify which advisors, experts, or mentors would be of most value if you win.
