Instructions for Use

This planning guide is to assist you in selecting your courses each term. Read carefully, as some courses are only offered in one term/year and some are offered in multiple terms/years.

Graduation Requirements

The Certificate of Health Care Assistant is awarded for the completion of the equivalent of one year of full-time study (39 credits) in the program. All program core courses are mandatory for graduation.

To graduate, students must pass all the required courses, and:

- complete 50% of the course work at Yukon University

- maintain a 2.00 cumulative GPA (C average) across all courses.

-achieve passing grades indicated in course outlines for each required course

Yukon University recognizes that a greater understanding and awareness of Yukon First Nations history, culture and journey towards self-determination will help to build positive relationships among all Yukon citizens. As a result, you will be required to achieve core competency in knowledge of Yukon First Nations.

Students in the HCA program acquire knowledge related to the First Nation Core Competencies through core program content and completion of YFN 101.

The Health Care Assistant Certificate is delivered as a full time one-year program on site at Ayamdigut campus. Each term offers a blend of in class theory courses and practica in Yukon health settings.

Common Words or Phrases Used in this Planning Guide

 Term or Semester = An Academic term is a portion of an academic year, the time during which an educational institution holds classes. At YukonU we have three terms each year. (see Fall, Winter & Spring/Summer below) *Note: not all programs use three (3) terms as part of their study schedule – most programs at YukonU use only the Fall & Winter term. 				
 Prerequisite = is a course that you must complete with a satisfactory grade before enrolling in another course. 				
Practicum = A required placement experience at a Yukon health care centre or program. Practica placements are arranged by program faculty and supervised by faculty.				
 Sequence (sample sequencing) = Courses that are arranged in an order according to year & term. 				
 Credits = A Credit is the unit of measurement for university courses. The credit is determined by the number of hours of instruction required each week. <u>Usually</u>, a course that lasts one term/semester is equivalent to three (3) credits. Note: credits for a course can range from 1 – 15. 				
• Yukon First Nations Core Competency = Yukon College recognizes that a greater understanding and awareness of Yukon First Nations history, culture and journey towards self-determination will help to build positive relationships among all Yukon citizens. As a result, you will be required to achieve core competency in knowledge of Yukon First Nations as part of your graduation requirements. (see Graduation Requirements below for more details)				
• GPA = is a representation of academic achievement produced by dividing the total number of grade points earned over a period, usually a semester, divided by the number of courses or credits taken. See page 18 of the Academic Regulations for a fuller explanation.				
Note: Terms or Semester exact dates are determined by your program. Some programs begin in August while others begin in September.				
 The following are the most common terms/semesters: Fall = Either Late August or early September through December Winter = Early January through April (Sometimes into early May)
