Graduation Requirements & Yukon First Nations Core Competency

The Practical Nurse diploma, comprised of course work in Nursing and Liberal Arts, is awarded for the completion of the equivalent of two years of full-time study.

To graduate, students must pass all the required courses and:

- complete 50% of the course work at Yukon University; and
- achieve a 64%, 75% or 80% as identified in each course outline and in the term summaries below.

Yukon First Nations Core Competency

Yukon University recognizes that a greater understanding and awareness of Yukon First Nations' history and culture and journey towards self-determination will help to build positive relationships among all Yukon citizens. As a result, all students are required to achieve core competency in knowledge of Yukon First Nations. Content within the Practical Nurse program meets this competency requirement. Course Sequencing

The Practical Nurse program is delivered over five full-time terms. The course are usually sequences as in the tables above, because **courses in each term are pre-requisites for courses in following terms.**

Students who are unable to continue the program for any reason are often able to return for completion in a subsequent program offering.

Yukon University's response to COVID-19 may necessitate some course deliveries by distance. If necessary, lab skills activities in Practical Nurse will be adapted to reflect public health requirements. Clinical courses will be assessed for safety and feasibility prior to scheduling.

Student Responsibility

Students are responsible for the completeness and accuracy of their course registrations and for determining the requirements of the program. Always read course descriptions before registering, to determine whether prerequisites have been met, and pay attention to notes on mutually exclusive and cross-listed courses (pairs of courses in which credit will be awarded for only one).
